Dear Members and Friends of St. Andrew:

The 6 Sundays of Easter (April 7 – May 12) this year feature Epistle Readings from the First Epistle of John. One of the main themes of this letter is love. John writes: "this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another. ... By this we know love, that he [Jesus] laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for one another.... Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. ... Whoever keeps his commandments abides in God, and God in him. And by this we know that he [Jesus] abides in us, by the Spirit whom he has given us" (1 John 3:11, 16, 18, 24).

Christ's commandment is the commandment he gave at his last supper with his disciples, after he took a basin of water and a towel, went from disciple to disciple, and washed their feet. Having done this, he said: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35).

Simply put, love (agape) is more than a warm, fuzzy feeling. It is an act of the will, doing what is in the best interest of another. It is genuine care for one another. It plays out in a variety of ways in the church. One way, in particular, is through our mutual support of one another as we seek to live out our faith in our daily lives.

We live in a broken, confused, confusing and corrupt world. Living out our faith with integrity and courage is challenging. This is where listening to one another, and listening to God's Word together, sharing our insights and understanding, and prayerfully supporting one another is love.

It happens when we gather for worship and fellowship. It happens in our Bible studies as we gather around God's Word and listen to God's Word, sharing our questions, experiences, understanding and insights. It happens in our meetings, as we prayerfully face challenges, issues, and questions. All of this is at the heart of our mission and ministry as the body of Christ. God has given us one another; we need one another. Christ, crucified and risen, lives among us to build us up as his people.

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

His application to the SMP Program at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne has been accepted! His journey will start in early September 2024!





Guided by the Tithe

God has demonstrated His love for us by creating and redeeming God has demonstrated His love for us by creating and redeeming us. A meaningful way we express our gratitude to God is through our faithful giving. By God's grace, we can make giving important, and, when we do, we give Him the glory and honor that He deserves. Faith enables us to give freely and generously. Our giving can have no greater foundation than the Gospel of forgiveness and God's promises.

In His Word, God gives us giving principles. We are called to give cheerfully, regularly, sacrificially, and proportionately of our firstfruits. Even with all these giving principles, one question that all of us have likely asked is, "How much should I give?" In the Old Testament, God answered that question. God's people were commanded to tithe, which meant they were to give one-tenth of their crops, livestock, and gold and silver. The tithe does not answer the question, "Why give?" However, it does help to answer the question, "How much should I give?"

The Apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 16:2, "On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper..." According to the income that we receive, we are to give proportionately. The tithe acts as a Biblical guide to calculate the dollar amount to give. Because Abraham, Jacob, and Moses tithed even before the law was given, could the tithe be a benchmark for us to consider as well?

In the New Testament, Jesus affirms the tithe when He told the Pharisees to continue tithing but not to neglect "the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness" (Matthew 23:23). It is interesting that, other than the tithe, the only giving referenced in the New Testament exceeded the tithe. Jesus asked His disciples to follow Him and leave everything they owned behind. He directed the Rich Young Ruler to give all His money away. Jesus commended the widow when she gave her last two mites. When He changed Zacchaeus' heart, Zacchaeus gave half of his wealth to the poor. Jesus said, "Freely you have received, freely give" (Matthew 10:8 NIV), and, in Acts 20:35, He said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

When we examine what we give, remember that God wants our hearts more than our gifts. May God grant us hearts of faith that give freely and generously.
